

SUPPLIES NEEDED FOR START OF SCHOOL YEAR
Grades 7 & 8

- 2 reams of copy (printer) paper
- 2 packages loose leaf paper
- 6 notebooks (single subject-for all subjects)
- 1 **CLEAR** plastic protractor
- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 ruler (metric & customary) **NOT BENDABLE**
- 3 pkg. pens (black or blue erasable)
- 2 pkg. pencils (#2)
- crayons (NO markers)
- colored pencils
- 1 glue stick
- 1 **plastic** durable box for supplies (shoe box size only)
- 2 rolls of paper towels
- 2 boxes of facial tissues
- 1 smock for art (**Required**)
- 5-7 book covers (cloth highly recommended) – 2 ex. large for literature & geography (Gr. 8)
- 1 containers of anti-bacterial wipes
